## TREASURER'S REPORT September 13, 2023

The NFHR has worked hard his year to contain costs, one of which is making the web site the primary vehicle for the Fjord Herald, the most expensive component of NFHR annual costs. This was a recommendation by the Finance Committee on which I served earlier this year who studied NFHR finances and made recommendation to the Board of Directors.

We will come through this year, but must focus on growth for next. Membership fees will not be raised but service fees will likely experience a small increase. This organization is as inflation prone as your horse feed and grocery bill. Strategies for overall growth in membership must be a priority.

Due to the increased fundraising and promotion this year, I am having our bookkeeper establish restricted and unrestricted accounts so that donors to the NFHR will be assured their contributions will be spent exactly as designated.

There have been wonderful fundraising efforts this year as well as generous donors. I applaud them and have even participated. However, the NFHR is not a charity, it is an agricultural corporation whose purpose qualifies it as tax-exempt business. To survive, a business needs growth and, it my opinion, the Board and NFHR members need to concentrate on this growth. Our business operation is efficient and well run. We took cost cutting measures this year which have had a significant effect. Expenses are not out of line or excessive. Income is the issue. Growth is the imperative.

It is for this reason, I advocated for formation of the Promotion Committee to bring the Norwegian Fjord Horse to the increased attention of the horse owner community and seek ways to make our wonderful breed more popular and in increased demand. We all remember the first time we saw a Fjord and determined to own one (or more). Member promotion and support is essential for the maintenance of the NFHR and its future.
